



## Clark Public Library 3D Printing Policy

The library's 3D printer may be used by the public to create three-dimensional objects in plastic. The library offers open hours or scheduled appointments to use the 3D printer. A Clark Public Library staff member must also be available to assist and troubleshoot any issues during the 3D printing process. Only Clark Public Library cardholders will be allowed to use the 3D printer.

1. The public will not be permitted to use the Library's 3D printers to create material that are:
  - Prohibited by local, state or federal law.
  - Unsafe, harmful, dangerous or possess an immediate threat to the well-being of others.
  - Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the library environment, including weapons.
  - In violation of another's intellectual property rights. For example, the printer may not be used to reproduce material that is subject to copyright, patent or trademark protection.
  - Any item designated not appropriate by the library staff.
2. Only designated library staff will have hands-on access to the 3D printer.
3. The library will charge \$.25 per 15 minutes to cover the cost of the replacement of filament. Only the library's filament is allowed to be used in the 3D printer.
4. Patrons interested in using the 3D printer must take the Clark Public Library's 3D printer demonstration prior to using the printer.
5. Please be aware the Clark Public Library is not responsible for storing or saving your designs and projects. You must bring your own USB flash drive.
6. Prints must be under 6 hours and must be completed before the library closes. Check the estimated time before printing.
7. Prints will be created by staff as time permits. Patrons will be notified when print is finished for pickup.
